Theatre programs start promptly at the advertised start time and latecomers will not be admitted until a suitable break in the performance. Smoking is not allowed in any part of the Pilbeam Theatre or other Council venues.

Please ensure all mobile phones are switched off before entering the auditorium. Crying or fidgety children can be a distraction to other theatregoers and performers, so if you bring your small child to the theatre, please book an aisle seat in case you need to exit the auditorium.

COVID-19 information

With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions, the Pilbeam Theatre is now back to full capacity. However, there are still some regulations we need to follow. When purchasing tickets, you will be asked to provide the names and contact details of all people in your booking group.


